AZ AMBER Alert Program



AZ AMBER Alert was created as an early warning system for law enforcement to alert the public when a child has been abducted and is in imminent danger of bodily harm or death. The program is a unique partnership between AZ broadcasters, law enforcement, AZ Department of Transportation and the Arizona Lottery. Funding provides continued education for law enforcement and the general public.



Scholarships



The ABA Foundation supports \$10,000 a year in scholarships at the Northern Arizona University School of Communications & Walter Cronkite School of Journalism & Mass Communications. Currently, a scholarship program and curriculum are being developed at the Pima Community College campus in Tucson, Arizona.



Summer H.S. Broadcast Institute at ASU & Native American H.S. Workshop at NAU

For two weeks every summer, the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism and Mass Communication brings high school students to ASU for intensive, hands-on experiences in broadcast and print journalism. The institute is designed to prepare students for college journalism studies and give them an opportunity to explore career options. Currently, a Native American H.S. broadcast workshop is being developed at Northern Arizona University School of Communications with anticipations to roll out in the summer of 2008.
